Dr. Pocheptsov was also a professor of social communication at Mariupol State University. He founded and was the first head of the Department of International Communications at the Institute of International Relations at the Taras Shevchenko University (1998–2001), also the founder, first head and professor of the Information Policy Department at the National Academy of Public Administration and head of the Marketing Department at Solomon's International University. He has been the head of the Office of Strategic Initiatives in the Administration

of the President of Ukraine (2002–2005). He has lectured at universities in Russia, USA, Germany, Austria, Estonia, Lithuania and Armenia. Prof. Pocheptsov has been involved in developing several educational programmes and has authored over 50 books. He is the author of the modern theory of strategy (2005), introduced the concept of “virtual screens” for marketing and psychological and information warfare, and he proposed the concept of ‘wars of sense’. He is also a renowned Ukrainian journalist.
